The Minister writes...

Dear friends

We have just started Lent—the period leading up to Easter in which we remember Jesus' fasting and temptation in the wilderness and are invited into a deeper relationship with God through prayer and abstinence. I had planned to write about this when I stumbled upon a reflection by Revd. J. John, Canon and Evangelist, which really struck a chord in me and I thought might be relevant and encouraging for you too. So forgive me for 'cheating' this month, but I'm going to share some of J. John's words with you. *

Thinking about he word 'Lent' caused J. John to reflect on its other meaning. He remarked that when you are *lent* something, you have it and can use it, but it doesn't really belong to you, and eventually you, as borrower, must return what you have borrowed to the lender. And because you don't own what you have been lent, you are responsible—and ultimately accountable—for how you use it.

Our lives are lent to us by God. He gives us life, breathing into us strength and our very existence on a daily basis. Therefore, we do not belong to ourselves but God and we should honour him with our bodies. (1 Cor. 6 v20)

These lives that we are lent will one day be taken back by God. Sometimes the date we are 'recalled' comes when we are ready and may even be a relief and release. Other times it may come when we are least expecting it and much earlier than hoped. Only God knows when the time will be but, as we are starkly reminded in the liturgy for Ash Wednesday, 'You are dust and to dust you shall return.' And then is added, almost as a therefore: 'Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.'

One day we will all give account to God for the lives we have been lent. When faced with criticism over some action, it's common for someone to protest, 'It's my life!' But, no, for none of us owns our life; we have only been lent it. So, how have we used the gifts and talents God has given us? As it says in Luke 12 v42-48 'From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked.' And, lest we should think too complacently that all we have is of our own doing and making, St Paul reminds us: 'What do you have that you did not receive?' (1 Cor. 4 v7). Though God is gracious and loving and offers us forgiveness in Christ, yet it's still important that we ask ourselves, "What have I done—or am I doing—with this life I have been lent?"

This Lent we can focus on saying particular prayers or skipping chocolate or

Distraction Thefts



Thames Valley Police is issuing advice to local residents following reported distraction thefts across the Bracknell and Wokingham areas.

Offenders appear to be targeting vulnerable and elderly individuals using a number of distraction techniques:

- Approaching the victim carrying a clipboard to engage with them and talk about charity work and donations. The criminal then tries to hug or kiss the victim in order to distract them and obtain their watch or wallet.
- Distracting victims at ATMs and car park payment machines by engaging them in conversation, asking questions or telling them they have dropped something. They then take their card and subsequently use this to make purchases or withdraw cash.
- Distracting victims when loading shopping into their car by asking them to sign something, look at a map or claiming someone has damaged their car and asking them to look. While the victim is distracted, the offender takes their handbag or purse. These offenders often work in teams with one watching the victim inputting their pin in the store or supermarket and another distracting them in the car park.
- Purse dipping at supermarkets. Purses have been taken from handbags left on trolleys or by dipping into an open handbag.

Please be alert and aware of anyone approaching you or near you when you are at an ATM, a payment machine or in a supermarket car park. Being aware of your surroundings and not distracted makes it harder for people to take advantage. Offenders may watch as you key in your PIN so please be vigilant. Always cover your PIN and keep an eye on your card at all times. If someone taps you on the shoulder or tries to speak to you, just ignore them.

If you see or suspect that a crime is taking place, please call the police on 999. If you have any information regarding these offences or witness any suspicious activity, please use our online reporting form at www.thamesvalley.police.uk or call 101. Alternatively, call Crimestoppers anonymously on free phone 0800 555 111.

Recycling for Good Causes


In memoriam plaques
