

The Minister writes...

Dear friends,

During Lent our Bible Study group has been looking at the final week in the life of Jesus. As we have read the account of his trial before Pilate, we came across that part of the story where Pilate offers the people the chance to set free a prisoner in honour of it being Passover. He gives them a choice: Jesus of Nazareth, an innocent man, or Barabbas, a murderer and insurrectionist. As we know, the crowd, incited by the Chief Priests, call for Barabbas to be freed and for Jesus to be crucified.

What struck us – and may indeed cause you to stop and reflect also – is that the name Barabbas translates as 'son of' (Bar) 'the father' (Abba). In Matthew's Gospel there is even a first name given to Barabbas: Jesus. And so we witness that Jesus



It is a short story – just a few verses - but it encapsulates a great truth. For we too (though I doubt that anyone reading this is an insurrectionist, let alone a murderer) are all sinners. In the eyes of a perfect God, we stand imperfect and tarnished by a myriad of sins both large and small. We too, like Barabbas, would stand condemned were it not for the fact that Jesus, the Son of the Father, has already taken our punishment upon himself on the cross on Good Friday. 'But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.' (Isaiah 53:5)



There are so many wonderful Passiontide and Easter hymns that remind us of Christ's astonishing act of love and grace and mercy but I thought you might like to read some that may be less familiar to you, from Vicky Beeching's 'The wonder of the cross' (#279 in Singing the Faith hymnbooks):

O precious sight, my Saviour stands, dying for me with outstretched hands

O precious sight; I love to gaze remembering salvation's day, remembering salvation's day

Though my eyes linger on this scene, may passing time and years not steal the power with which it impacts me, the freshness of its mystery, the freshness of its mystery

May I never lose the wonder, the wonder of the cross.
May I see it like the first time, standing as a sinner lost.
Undone by mercy and left speechless, watching wide-eyed at the cost
May I never lose the wonder, the wonder of the cross
Behold the God-man crucified, the perfect sinless sacrifice

Christian Aid Week 14th-20th May

Another Christian Aid Week will soon be upon us. The need to help the poorest in the world continues, particularly given the impact of Climate Change

Raising money is proving a challenge. Not because of the Cost of Living Crisis or donor fatigue but due to changes in how our society operates. People are spurning cash and using cards. You can take donations for Christian Aid using a card machine, but this takes time and is unsuitable for House to House collections or street collections. Then people's habits have changed as to when they will be at home, has made House to House collections difficult. This is compounded by a growing reluctance to even answer the door. Nationally Quiz Nights have done well but locally there is not one in 2023. That leaves us with Church collections ,which our Church supports, but many do not. So, what is the future?

Whilst there will be a few House to House collections this year we will again try a new scheme where you pop a specific Christian Aid envelope in say up to 20 of your neighbours' doors. The envelopes have your address on, and the recipients are asked to return the envelope to you. This has had varied success elsewhere, but you don't know until you have tried it.

Then Christian Aid aims to build on the success of the Big Brekkie and help support other fund-raising events.....with the usual suspects: coffee mornings, sponsorships and concerts coming to mind. New challenges to raise money but new opportunities. As we are de facto all members of Christian Aid what do you want to do?

Response to the new 'Illegal Migration Bill'

Issued on 8th March 2023

Church Leaders from the Methodist Church, the United Reformed Church and the Baptist Union have signed the following joint statement expressing opposition to the government's new 'Illegal Migration Bill':

We are appalled by the proposals in the government's 'Illegal Migration Bill' to detain, punish and reject thousands of people seeking safety. They are completely incompatible with our Christian conviction that all human beings are made in the image of God, and are therefore inherently worthy of treatment which honours their dignity. Instead of dignity, these plans will foster discrimination and distrust, and cause immeasurable harm to people already made vulnerable by conflict and persecution. If ever there was a contemporary example of ignoring our neighbour and walking by on the other side, this is it.

When two in three people who cross the channel to seek sanctuary in the UK are granted asylum following rigorous checks, it seems unthinkable to reject them before they have even had a chance to have their claim for asylum heard. Many people fleeing war and persecution in countries such as Iraq, Iran, Syria, Eritrea and Sudan have been left with no safe and accessible routes to claim asylum in the UK, forcing people to make difficult and dangerous decisions. The UK falls far behind our global neighbours in welcoming people seeking sanctuary into our communities, and yet these plans essentially put a ban on claiming asylum and reject the UK's responsibility to play our part in responding to global inequalities and conflict.

We all agree that we cannot continue to see thousands of people risk their lives to reach safety in the UK, but the solution cannot be deterrence and punishment. As Christians, we believe that we should be amongst the first to welcome the stranger with open arms. We urge the government to withdraw this legislation, to honour our moral and international obligations and to behave with compassion and fairness by establishing safe and accessible routes to enable the UK to play its part in welcoming people in need of safety.
