The Minister writes...

Dear friends,

'That which was lost is found!'

I mislaid my keys the other day – the keys to my car, the house, the garage and some other keys (of indeterminate-but-no-doubt-very-important purpose).

I'm not the kind of person who normally loses keys because they're always kept in one of two places – either my handbag or the key rack. Only they weren't. And believe me, I looked through that handbag multiple times, eventually emptying it out and finding a lot of things I didn't know were in there, including a metal tape measure, a split herbal



tea bag, a vial of anointing oil(!) and some gone-soft polo mints. But no keys. Definitely.

Of course it wasn't a convenient time to lose them. Well, obviously it wouldn't be, but this was *particularly* inconvenient as I was due to lead worship and needed to get to the church. In the end I had to phone someone to come and pick me up (Mike being away) and I made it with ten minutes to spare, but flustered and preoccupied. Where *could* those keys be??

Perhaps you've lost something important too? Maybe keys, or a wallet, your phone, a passport, a certificate? If so you will know the feelings of frustration and anxiety and then, when finally found, the relief and joy.

It reminded me of the story of the woman who lost one of her ten silver coins (no doubt part of her dowry) and swept and cleaned her home from top to bottom until she eventually found it and invited her neighbours for a party, she was so happy! Jesus used that parable to illustrate the joy in heaven when one lost soul is restored. And how much more important are people than possessions?

I wonder if there's been a time in your life when it wasn't some *thing* that you mislaid but your self or your faith? A time when you wandered away? Perhaps you stopped coming to church because there was something else that got in the way on Sundays. Or maybe you continued to come but you felt lost inside? Like what you'd always believed no longer fitted where you were at. Your oncesimple faith could not provide the answers to the questions that your life circumstances were throwing at you. Why has someone I love got cancer? Why am I constantly dealing with a problem that won't go away? Why do I feel depressed when everyone around me seems to be happily getting on with life? Why am I still grieving years later? Why has God gone silent on me?

Christian Aid update



Christian Aid Week is over for another year. In these changing times, fundraising for the poorest in the world needs to go on for 52 weeks of the year so watch out for new initiatives.

Once again, our Church held an envelope collection and when this is counted and banked, the amount raised will be reported. Increasingly more of us donate online or by phone (which is great!) but this cannot be reported down to Church level.

The country highlighted in Christian Aid Week was Malawi which suffered a 34-day long cyclone, Cyclone Freddy in March. This was one of the strongest storms ever recorded dropping a year's worth of rain and causing much devastation.

Christian Aid partners in Malawi responded to the immediate recovery needs of communities. In Malawi. This includes:

- Corn soya blend for porridge for breastfeeding mothers and children under 5 years
- Mosquito nets for families to provide protection against malaria.
- Providing temporary toilets and bathrooms, water containers and water treatment to help prevent the risk of cholera.
- Mobile clinics to help people process the emotional trauma of the cyclone.
 Distribution of cash to 1,000 households so that families can purchase

Distribution of cash to 1,000 households so that families can purchase their immediate needs.

Jen and Esther, pigeon pea farmers who featured in the Christian Aid Week literature, were impacted by the cyclone. Jen had to leave home for a while and some of her crops were washed away. Yields for the year will also be down for both farmers. The good news however, is that the initiatives on pigeon peas will continue to be rolled out by Christian Ais partners to another 3 districts this year.

probably better to use white, yellow, orange, pink—bright (advancing) colours.

It is lovely to be able to give flowers to members of the congregation—a ministry of flowers.

Just talk to Sue T about the words you'd like and they will provide the plaque for free! Doug W has been attaching them to the seats once done. Thanks Doug!



Recycling for Good Causes

In the vestibule you will notice a largish box which advertises 'Recycling for good causes.'

Please donate your unwanted items from the following list. There are some leaflets available which tell you about what can be recycled but basically it is: Unwanted jewellery - including damaged items and costume jewellery and watches

Coins and currency - any age and UK and foreign both acceptable

Mobile phones, cameras, video cameras and gadgets including ipods, tablets but NOT laptops.

Stamps - single, loose and presentation packs.

The box contains a sack. When the sack is full Recycling for Good Causes will collect it and the church will receive 75% of the proceeds from the sale of the contents within about 8 weeks of collection. (As a guide, at High Cross they received a cheque for £80 - so it is definitely worth doing this!)
