The Minister writes...



Dear friends,

This is the time of year when it is not unusual to see skeins of geese flying overhead. Often our attention is drawn to them because we hear them honking as they fly and we look up, marvelling at that distinctive 'V' and perhaps wondering, are they just flying to safe pasture for the night or is this the start for them of a much longer, migratory journey?

A couple of weeks ago was World Migratory Birds Day and I found myself reading about migrating birds — well, specifically about migrating geese actually — and I discovered that there are some things we could learn from them. So here are my **five lessons from the geese**:

Lesson 1: We travel farther together

Geese flying in a V-formation can travel 71% farther than if they flew alone. The birds fly in other birds' slip streams, thus reducing the effort each individual bird has to make and preserving their strength. All but the lead bird of course — but I will come to that one in a minute. When we share our journey of faith — praying, serving, worshipping together — we find strength and encouragement we could never have alone. Who helps you to keep going in faith? Who do you lift up?

Lesson 2: We take turns to lead

When the lead goose tires, it drops back and another takes the front. Christian life is about service and sharing the load. In the church, we each have times to lead and times to follow. What or who has helped you when it has been your turn to lead?

Lesson 3: We encourage each other

Geese do a lot of honking! Whether on water, land or in the air. But did you know that when they are flying the honking isn't just noise — it's encouragement! Our words can lift or crush others; encouragement is a holy habit.

Lesson 4: We care for the weak

When a goose is injured or falls ill and has to drop out of the skein, two or three others stay with it until it either recovers or dies. In doing so, they are left behind from their original formation. They will have to join another flock in order to continue their journey or, if it is too late, they will have to overwinter where they have landed. That's a picture of true fellowship and compassion. The flock cares for its weak and so must we.

Lesson 5: We have a destination

The geese aren't just flying idly – they have a destination: they are heading home. So are we — this earth is not our home as the old hymn goes; we are pilgrims on the way to God's kingdom.

So my prayer for our fellowship is that we may we be a flock that flies in formation — following Christ, encouraging one another, and trusting that God will bring us safely home.

On Saturday 18th October we held Messy Harvest at Church. There were about 20 children who attended (difficult to count them as they dart around!) with one or two of their grown ups, so the hall was really rather full. We had brilliant activities: A scarecrow trail, making pasta and leaf owls, potato printing, colouring a beautiful picture drawn by Heather, colouring sheets, decorating and filling autumn baskets, decorating biscuits and colouring wooden leaves with paint markers (the Dads really liked this must remember to get wooden decorations for Messy Christmas!) All this time, Wendy kept us in refreshments and biscuits, which were very welcome.

We then went into church. Each child was given a bag and had to find several autumn things which were hidden around the church i.e., acorn, stick etc - children are so competitive, they put their hearts and soul into finding each item. A full bag brought to the front was rewarded in either a Milky Way or bag of Haribo sweets.

We then had a harvest story with the children coming up onto the stage and showing us how little seeds grow with pitter-patter rain and sunshine, into tall plants which the farmer can harvest. We sang harvest lyrics to the tune of The Wheels on the Bus.

After a prayer and blessing all the little ones went home. Us grown ups were quite exhausted! However a really good time was enjoyed. We have the same children come time and again and it is lovely to see them having such a good time.

Let's do it all again for Messy Christmas with Christingle - **Sunday 14th December** at 3 - 4.30 pm - if you fancy coming along and helping out, even just handing out teas and coffees, that would be wonderful. Come and join in the fun!

Christmas Day worship?

Dear friends,

A second letter this month but one about a particular subject, concerning which I and the Church Council need to hear back from you.

When the stewards and I were planning for the services over December and the Christmas period we realised that – for very understandable reasons - there would be no stewards available on Christmas Day itself. We began to think about what we could do instead but realised that it is not just about finding stewards to cover, we have a greater problem.

Over the past several years it has become clear that for many of our congregation the Carol Service on the Sunday before Christmas has really become their main Christmas service. It is a popular and uplifting service and we get a good turn-out for it, which is wonderful.

Christmas Day however is a different scenario altogether. A lot of you go to family or friends and are not around to attend church. This includes the stewards, those on Multimedia and the musicians. We really struggle to put on a service. Last year, even with the attendance of my own and Keg's family our congregation only amounted to 13. The year before (when I was leading worship elsewhere) there were even fewer at our church.

This Christmas Day I will be leading worship at Bracknell and we would need to find a Local Preacher to take our service. However, the stewards and I feel it is a big ask to request a preacher for a service which may turn out to be just the preacher themselves and a few others who are there because they are 'on duty.'

I don't write of this to make any of you feel guilty! Times are changing and so is the demographic of our church family. Why I am writing is to put to you a somewhat radical alternative (with the backing of Church Council): what are your thoughts on us NOT holding a Christmas Day service in our own church but instead joining with our friends at Crowthorne Methodist Church? Or even with Sandhurst Baptist Church? Both churches would welcome extra people with open arms.

Please can you feedback to myself or the stewards your thoughts on this proposal? I know that none of us like change, especially when it seems to reflect a downward turn, but here's the rub: it is not enough to simply say you object if you yourself know that you cannot attend on Christmas Day! So please consider prayerfully.



Because the wall behind the communion table is black, some flower colours (dark red, blue or purple—receding) don't show up very well unless very carefully surrounded by light foliage. It is probably better to use white, yellow, orange, pink—bright (advancing) colours.

It is lovely to be able to give flowers to members of the congregation—a ministry of flowers.

A statement on the announcement of a ceasefire in Gaza

We welcome the announcement that Hamas and Israel have agreed to the first phase of a deal that will release all hostages and see Israeli troops withdraw to an agreed line.



Many have prayed for the release of captives on both sides and for an end to the violence. We thank God that these prayers are beginning to be answered.

While this is a significant move toward a ceasefire, lasting peace will require much more. The current 20-point peace plan under

negotiation does not address the deeper injustices in the history and present reality of the Holy Land.

In the West Bank, Israel continues to expand illegal settlements through legislation and the actions of violent settler groups, often supported by the Israeli Defence Forces. Palestinians face increasing restrictions on movement, and violent confrontations continue daily.

The West Bank is notably absent from the current peace plan, suggesting that self-determination for Palestinians is not a priority for those leading the peace process.

If the plan succeeds, Gaza may be rebuilt and governed by Palestinians. But the broader relationship between Israel, Gaza, and the West Bank will remain unchanged. The ongoing occupation of the West Bank and the blockade of Gaza have failed to provide freedom for Palestinians or security for Israelis. Without addressing these root issues, the region risks falling back into an uneasy peace, maintained by force and vulnerable to future unrest and violence.

We welcome these first steps toward ending the war on Gaza. We continue to pray for a peace process that delivers justice, security, self-determination, and respect for human rights for all. We urge the international community to support a process that builds on this agreement and leads to a lasting and just peace in the region.



Recycling for Good Causes

In the vestibule you will notice a largish box which advertises 'Recycling for good causes.'

Please donate your unwanted items from the following list. There are some leaflets available which tell you about what can be recycled but basically it

Unwanted jewellery - including damaged items and costume jewellery and watches

Coins and currency - any age and UK and foreign both acceptable

Mobile phones, cameras, video cameras and gadgets including ipods, tablets but NOT laptops.

Stamps - single, loose and presentation packs.

The box contains a sack. When the sack is full Recycling for Good Causes will collect it and the church will receive 75% of the proceeds from the sale of the contents within about 8 weeks of collection. (As a guide, at High Cross they received a cheque for £80 - so it is definitely worth doing this!)
