The Minister writes...

Lent: Choosing the Right Path

Dear friends,

Back in 2024 when I was on sabbatical, my good friend Lindsey and I were walking the Three Castles Path (from Windsor to Winchester via St John's Castle at Odiham). It's a distance of 60 miles in total, although we did it in very small increments over a long period.

The sabbatical gave us the opportunity to complete the last third of it. One particular day we were walking steadily along, in good spirits and chatting cheerfully. At some point, distracted by the conversation, we missed a signpost. The path in front of us still looked perfectly pleasant – and nice and easy downhill too! - so we thought nothing of it.


It was only much later — when the landmarks no longer matched the map — that we realised we had been on the wrong track. You can imagine how down in the dumps we felt! Our choice was either to retrace our steps all the way uphill or take a very long detour to get back to where we should have been.

It occurs to me how much that resembles our spiritual journeys.

Lent comes round each year, not to make us miserable, and not simply to encourage us to give up chocolate, but to help us notice which direction we are heading. The Gospels tell us that Jesus spent forty days in the wilderness, where he faced very real temptations — to take easier paths, quicker routes, more comfortable options. Each time, despite personal cost, he chose the way that kept him close to his Father.

In our own day, the “wrong turnings” are rarely dramatic. They are usually small. We become distracted. We stop paying attention. Prayer slips. Patience wears thin. A resentment is quietly held on to. Grief, illness or worry get in our way and trip us up. We don't set out to wander from God — we simply fail to notice we've drifted. And like that country track, the way can look perfectly pleasant for quite some time.....

The good news of Lent is that it is never too late to pause, check the map, and turn back. God does not sigh impatiently when we retrace our steps.



Jesus walks with us, even on the detours. Indeed, he is often the one who gently shows us the signpost we missed.

Following in Christ's footsteps is not about dramatic gestures. It is about steady attention — choosing kindness over sharpness, hope over despair, trust over anxiety. It is about walking deliberately with him, rather than simply assuming we are on the right road.

Perhaps this Lent we might quietly ask ourselves from time to time: “Lord, am I still walking with you?” And if we discover we have wandered a little, we need not be downcast. The path back is always open.



Online Lent Course

Last year in the UK children made up 25% of victims of modern slavery, as logged by the UK's National Referral Mechanism - 5,999 children! In response, Chris Elliott (the Southwark Diocese lead on modern slavery) and Rev Hazel Forecast (Methodist Minister in Redhill) are leading an on-line 6-week course **Children in the Shadows Revisited**, prepared by the Clewer Initiative. If you can't get to your local church Lent course - or in addition to it - you would be welcome to join us.

Using short films, insight from frontline experts, examples of good practice, reflections arising from Luke 18, and discussion points, each session will explore a different aspect of child exploitation:

- The shocking truth about children & modern slavery in the UK
- The generational impact: how children of modern slavery victims are affected
- Behind the Screen: protecting children from online grooming and exploitation
- 'County lines' in 2026 and how parents can respond
- Fighting county lines in our schools
- The global picture: children and modern slavery across the world

The course will run 7.30-9.00pm each Tuesday from 24th February to 31st March

Sandhurst and Yateley Methodist Church 120 years old this May!

Here is a significant date for your diaries.....

We will be celebrating the 120th anniversary of our church on **Sunday 10th May**.

The first Wesleyan congregation met in Sandhurst in the open air on 1 January 1865, later moving into a barn and eventually into a brick chapel which opened in 1869. 36 years later the chapel was in need of major repairs and the decision was made to acquire a new site and build a new church. The resulting Sandhurst New Wesleyan Church opened for worship on 2 May 1906.* This was the church we now call Sandhurst & Yateley Methodist Church. Since the opening services took place over several Sundays, we have chosen Sunday 10 May for our celebration.

There will be a special service led by **Revd. John Amankwatia**, followed by lunch and a drama reflecting the church's history. It will be a joyful day of thanksgiving for God's faithfulness and the vision of those early Methodists.

Please put the date in your diary. More details will follow in the next newsletter.

*Information on the history of the church was taken from 'A Winding Lane in the Wilderness' a local history of Methodism in Sandhurst, compiled by Elizabeth Godden. It is a most interesting read which I can highly recommend. SG

Because the wall behind the communion table is black, some flower colours (dark red, blue or purple—receding) don't show up very well unless very carefully surrounded by light foliage. It is probably better to use white, yellow, orange, pink—bright (advancing) colours.

It is lovely to be able to give flowers to members of the congregation—a ministry of flowers.

Recycling for Good Causes

In the vestibule you will notice a largish box which advertises 'Recycling for good causes.'

Please donate your unwanted items from the following list. There are some leaflets available which tell you about what can be recycled but basically it is:

Unwanted jewellery - including damaged items and costume jewellery and watches

Coins and currency - any age and UK and foreign both acceptable

Mobile phones, cameras, video cameras and gadgets including ipods, tablets but NOT laptops.

Stamps - single, loose and presentation packs.

The box contains a sack. When the sack is full Recycling for Good Causes will collect it and the church will receive 75% of the proceeds from the sale of the contents within about 8 weeks of collection. (As a guide, at High Cross they received a cheque for £80 - so it is definitely worth doing this!)
