The Minister writes...

Dear friends,

I was walking around Ambarrow Woods last weekend and came across hundreds of bluebells – the true English bluebells with their gentle scent and sweetly drooping heads. I took lots of photos on my phone but it was hard to do them justice or to decide whether to go for close-ups or attempt to capture scenes that looked like an

impressionist's painting.

In British folklore, bluebells are sometimes called 'fairy flowers.' One old legend says that they ring to summon fairies—and that anyone who hears them may be drawn deeper into the woods, never quite finding their way out again. I'm not so sure about that(!) but there certainly was something enchanting about them which had drawn lots of walkers that day. I had only turned up to walk the dog – a happy accident - but others it seemed had had word and had come specially to enjoy them whilst they could. For it is only for a few short weeks they transform the ground on which they grow into a purple-blue mist.

I think the bluebells can teach us some spiritual lessons. In the Victorian 'language of flowers' they symbolise humility, constancy, and gratitude.

You have to go to quiet places to find them. They are not showy plants demanding that we should notice them but with a humble grace they beautify wherever they grow. We have to slow down and open our eyes if we want to see them before they fade. How often does God speak to us in quiet ways? If we are busy and rushing or if the clamour of life is too loud, we can miss his still small voice of calm. Their bowed heads suggest an attitude of prayer and we can find God best in prayer. Can we too beautify the places in which we live and grow?

We see constancy in how these little flowers return year upon year. Given the right conditions the bluebells will spread, not in neat, planted rows but forming a carpet of colour – like the slow, almost unseen growth of God's kingdom. They remind us that we need to remain faithful if we hope to be part of that flourishing, if we too want to be part of that transformation.

Lastly, the bluebells are a symbol of gratitude. They certainly invoked gratitude in me and in those other walkers that day. There was privilege in the sight and scent of them, of being reminded of spring-times past and the awareness that we are each a small part of something so much bigger and more wonderful than we can ever adequately describe. All we can do is give thanks to God for his love displayed in Creation and in Jesus.



May the lessons of the bluebells stay with us throughout the rest of this post-Easter season.

In quiet woods where bluebells ring,
A softer note than birds in spring,
They bow their heads as if in prayer,
And fill with grace the hidden air.

Bible study boring? No way! Why not give it a try and find out for yourselves.

Along with praying, the reading of Scripture is a very important way of growing spiritually and studying it together helps it come alive. We learn from study guides and from each other. None of us are super-spiritual or have all the answers but together we grapple with the difficult bits and enjoy the more straightforward parts. There are no 'foolish' questions so if you've been coming to church for years and are concerned that you maybe aren't as familiar with the Bible as you feel you 'should' be - well don't be embarrassed or let that stop you giving this a go.



It isn't necessary to attend every week - just join us as and when you can.

We meet by Zoom. If you're not sure about Zoom and haven't given it a go before, then please ask me (Sharon) and I can help you. Joining a Zoom meeting is free. You don't have to have a Zoom account, you just need a link (see below for the link we use), and a laptop, tablet (e.g. iPad) or smartphone. We start at 7.45pm for a short time of chat and prayer and begin the study at 8pm, finishing around 9pm.

During May we continue with our study of John's gospel.

We will meet on 5th, 12th and 26th May. Please note there is NO Bible study on 19th May as Sharon is on annual leave.

Looking ahead:

June is Bible month and we will join with other Methodist Churches across the Connexion in looking at Paul's Letter to the Philippians. This will be reflected in the preaching on Sunday as well as in our Bible studies so there should be a very joined-up feel to it all. In fact, this might be a very good month to try the Bible study if you haven't done so before!

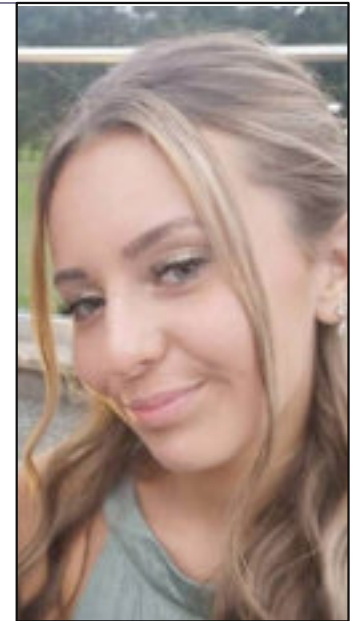

And... from Douglas

Dr James Russell MD (1851–1933) was many things: Medical Officer to East Hampstead RDC, possibly Sandhurst's first GP, and the first chairman of Sandhurst Parish Council. He also donated the land on which our church was built.

For this last reason, I made him the protagonist of my play about our church's history since its opening on 2nd May 1906. I tried to imagine him following our church's history from that date to today: its 120th Anniversary. How would he react to the way his church developed? How would he sum up its history?

Come along on **10th May 2026** and find out. Some details may surprise you.

Gift Day - Sunday 10th May

We are currently expecting an overspend of around £4400 by the end of the tax year. While Gift Aid and lower utility bills may help, we are only just breaking even and wish to avoid using our reserves.

Because the wall behind the communion table is black, some flower colours (dark red, blue or purple—receding) don't show up very well unless very carefully surrounded by light foliage. It is probably better to use white, yellow, orange, pink—bright (advancing) colours.

It is lovely to be able to give flowers to members of the congregation—a ministry of flowers.

A new way of life

So much is going on:

A chapel outside the town of Nantwich has shown how mission can grow when a church chooses to welcome young families and listen to its community. At Broomhall and Sound Methodist Church in Cheshire, lay worker Kathryn Davies has worked to help shape the family ministry that began with a toddler group and has since expanded into after-school activities, holiday clubs, a twins' support group and even a pedal-tractor run dreamed up by two young boys.

Tucked inside Hathersage Methodist Church, a quiet revolution is taking place - one made not of noise, but of pages turning. 'The Book Room', a second hand bookshop inspired by John Wesley's publishing house, has quickly become a beloved stop for locals and visitors wandering through this Peak District village. Part of the Church's wider open-door initiative, the space has welcomed more than 10,000 people in just 8 months. That's around 42 curious wanderers a day stepping inside to explore Methodist history, pause for prayer, let children play, tackle a communal jigsaw or browse the ever-changing shelves of pre-loved books.

Keen walkers are being sought to test parts of a new pilgrimage route designed by a Past President of the Methodist Conference and launched in honour of a pioneering abolitionist. 80-mile Equiano Way is due to open next March and runs from Sheffield to Hull via the Epworth Old Rectory. The Revd Dr Inderjit Bhogal, Past President of the Methodist Conference, and Sarah Maltby, the manager of Epworth Old Rectory, are asking walkers to scope sections of the route ahead of its opening. The trail currently passes through

different communities, urban landscapes and follows the Humber estuary.

Karen Allen, Regional Safeguarding Manager for the North East, shares this blog in the series reflecting on ten years since the Past Cases Review. The report, 'Courage, Cost and Hope' was a pivotal moment for safeguarding in the Methodist Church. Ten years later I am still reminded by many, in particular ecumenical colleagues, as to what an ambitious and progressive report this was. I continue to be proud that Methodist safeguarding is 'ahead of the game' and my counterparts from our ecumenical partners often tell me that they 'watch and wait' to see what we do.

On the weekend of 11 and 12 April, the Methodist Church attended the National Wedding Show in London for the first time. A team of six people from across the Connexion helped celebrate the Methodist Church as a loving, inclusive and welcoming denomination, the perfect place to consider getting married. Over two days, the team spoke with hundreds of people, sharing over 500 copies of the new guide to marriage in the Methodist Church, 'Not your Ordinary Marriage', with many people leaving a prayer on the prayer tree that was part of the display stand.

Recycling for Good Causes

In the vestibule you will notice a largish box which advertises 'Recycling for good causes.'

Please donate your unwanted items from the following list. There are some leaflets available which tell you about what can be recycled but basically it is:
Unwanted jewellery - including damaged items and costume jewellery and watches

Coins and currency - any age and UK and foreign both acceptable

Mobile phones, cameras, video cameras and gadgets including ipods, tablets but NOT laptops.

Stamps - single, loose and presentation packs.

The box contains a sack. When the sack is full Recycling for Good Causes will collect it and the church will receive 75% of the proceeds from the sale of the contents within about 8 weeks of collection. (As a guide, at High Cross they received a cheque for £80 - so it is definitely worth doing this!)
